

Art and Design Areas of study

Critical study - learners are required to gain knowledge and understanding of the work of other artists/designers/craftspeople/ cultures.



Materials/media – learners are required to explore and experiment with new materials and techniques.

Outcome – learners are required to create a personal piece/pieces of work based on their studies within the topic, prior knowledge, reflection and refinement.

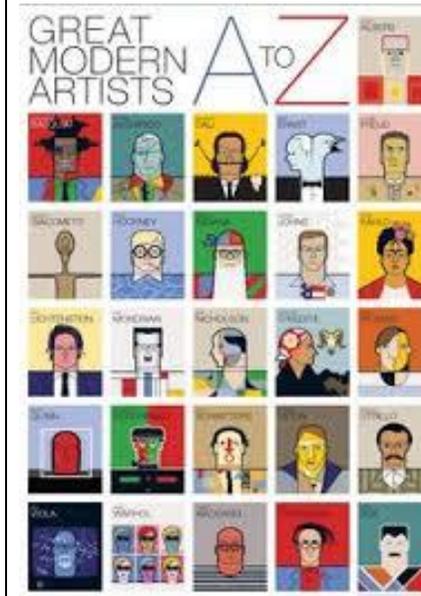
Drawing – record information from observation.

Teaching and Learning episodes

1. Learners will be able to select an artist from a range of choices, using books and the internet to gain background information about their artist and their work, analysing and forming opinions.
2. Learners will create an art history poster using the written and visual information they have gathered, applying knowledge about poster design and text within art.
3. Learners will extend their knowledge and presentation skills by completing a 6 page booklet about their artist.
4. Learners will use a range of materials and skills to complete their poster and booklet, water colour washes, pencil crayon layers, paint, stencils and letter blocks.
5. Composition and presentation will be considered and adjusted throughout both pieces.
6. Within the booklet learners will create their own piece of work in the style of the artist, considering context, colour, technique.
7. Reflect and refine.

Drawing elements and prior knowledge should be used when copying and interpreting the images used within the poster and the book.
